




Many years ago when I married my "bride" she was described by many friends as an "enthusiastic antique collector", having been raised in a late 1800's house in New England. Our home was filled with antiques passed down from previous generations of family members. Aquariums, regardless of the size, were relegated to the fishroom in the basement; they simply did not fit the decor of our home. One Sunday afternoon we traveled to the north side of Omaha to visit a little hole-in-wall fish shop run by a sweet little old lady. After wandering around the shop for a bit my wife said to me "come, look at this". Tucked in the back corner of the shop was an antique aquarium, showing its age and in need of much repair. Surprisingly, my wife said to me, "Let's buy it, if it's not too expensive." After considerable negotiation with the proprietor of the shop, the aquarium was loaded into the back of our station wagon for the trip home.

Arriving home, we were met by our neighbor, who was the owner of a local machine shop in town. He helped me get the very heavy aquarium out of the car and into the garage. He looked down at our find, shook his head and commented, "THAT is some kind of ugly". The words were not out of his mouth before he realized he had hurt our feelings. Several days later he approached my wife and said he would be willing to take it to the shop and clean it up if she wished; he was obviously attempting to make up for his previous comments. He did take it to the shop and later in the week he returned it to the house. It had been sandblasted and the rust had been totally removed from the wrought iron and was covered with a coat of fresh black paint. It looked fantastic! I spent the weekend cleaning the glass and re-sealing the inside of the aquarium to make sure it would not leak water on the hardwood floors.

Several weeks later it was installed in the living room between two caned chairs and across the room from a large Victorian couch. It looked very similar to To Table of Contents



picture to the left, but the eagles did not adorn the top of our unit. As you can see the aquariums of the day were not very deep and there was no opportunity for a cover or a light. We settled on three very nice large Oranda goldfish and it adorned our living room for a number of years. In fact it became a point of conversation when people would visit our home. Eventually the military moved us to a new assignment and with much regret the antique aquarium found a new home in Omaha.


Unfortunately, we never found another replacement in our travels and now that I can search on the internet they are few and far between and the prices are out of sight. I have included a number of photos of ones I have found - some very simple and other much more ornate. Historical records indicate they were very fashionable in the late 1800's in the wealthy homes of America and in Europe. They were a mix of aquariums and bowls that sat atop ornate stands. There was a revival of vintage aquariums and ornate fishbowls during the Air Deco period of the 1920's. Even up through that period the inhabitants of both the aquarium and particularly the fishbowls were mostly limited to goldfish. The literature of the times does mention occasionally the keeping of Paradise Fish in these aquariums.

Finally, Zoo Med founder Gary Bagnall is a diehard aquarist and he entertains an extensive collection of vintage fishbowls and aquariums. 
